Is Butte County poised to be the first in CA to ban fracking? Who would have believed that Butte County could be the first in California to adopt a ban on fracking?!

A few days ago, we were elated to watch as our elected leaders vocalized their support for a ban on fracking in Butte County and then voted 4-1 to proceed with drafting the language for a ban. (Thank you to Lambert, Kirk, Teeter and Connelly for supporting this.) Not a moratorium, not a soft regulation of fracking through a conditional use permit (which was presented on the agenda), but an actual BAN. No other county in CA has yet banned fracking, so we stand ready to become the first!



BEC joined dozens of citizen activists at a public hearing on fracking at the Butte County Board of Supervisors meeting on Tuesday, April 8th. The hearing was held on the question of whether to limit or regulate the practice of hydraulic fracturing for natural gas in Butte County through a change to the Zoning Code, which would have required a conditional use permit and environmental review. The outcome of the discussion was that the Supervisors voiced support for a ban on fracking. That was a better outcome than any of us could have predicted. You can imagine the cheers and excitement from the crowd during the discussion and the final vote! It felt like a huge victory for all who have worked to push this issue over the past year and a half!

But wait: we haven't banned fracking yet! The next step is to present the language for a ban at an upcoming Supervisors meeting, which will likely take place in May or June. BEC will be involved in facilitating final adoption of the ordinance, and we'll keep you posted as things develop.

Meanwhile, grassroots petition-gathering efforts continue for a fracking ban. These signatures are needed to show public support for this ban, since now the opposition will most certainly come out of the woodwork. **Volunteers are needed now** throughout Butte County to help gather at least 7,500 signatures or as many as 15,000. A volunteer training will take place this Saturday, April 12 at 1pm at the Chico Peace & Justice Center.

- Amazing local bands including: The Upstairs Neighbours, Electric Canyon




We'll see you on **Saturday, May 3rd from 11am-5pm**, at One-Mile in Bidwell Park.



BEC is hosting two upcoming water workshops that will help you conserve even more!





Groundwater Watch

If there is a silver lining to the 2014 drought, it might be that we're finally seeing some new rules proposed for regulating groundwater. CA's oversight of groundwater has been limited: left to local jurisdictions where boundaries do not coincide with those of the hidden, often exploited resource below. Because the groundwater for which our lives depend, the Tuscan Aquifer system, flows widely beneath political boundaries, our local regulations are only as good as our neighbor's regulations.



BEC's water policy analyst, Carol Perkins attended a recent public hearing in Sacramento on March 24. Voices for the environment and the North State were underrepresented, as usual. BEC's comments focused on the need to regulate at the local level but also to ensure that the "local voice" is not granted solely to irrigation districts, which were established for an entirely different purpose and that do not represent the majority of water users.

While California's readiness to address groundwater management issues is a promising sign, we also have concerns. Reform and solutions should be regionally centric, with a strong basis in the local hydrology and geology. Would the state's

regulations supersede Butte County's existing protections for groundwater? The focus on groundwater banking as a method of water storage raises questions of state control over private use rights of groundwater. Rest assured, **BEC will continue to watchdog this important issue at the state level and strive to ensure that the environment and the North State is represented as groundwater policy is developed.**

Amanda's departure means we now have one vacancy on the BEC Board -- just in time for our June Election. **Have you considered getting more involved with BEC?** All BEC members are eligible to serve on the BEC Board of Directors. 
