

Withdrawal of Applications for Durham Villas Planned Development

After years of debate over the <u>Durham Villas Project</u>, (a 139-unit housing development on 118-acres of existing orchard East of the railroad tracks in Durham, CA) the applications have been withdrawn by the applicant.

BEC has been following this project with concern about the potential impacts on the local groundwater supply and the water quality in the Butte Creek watershed. Protecting our land, air and water demands vigilance, and would not be possible without the support of community members like you. **Thank** you for giving a voice to your local environment!



Did you know that the **Endangered Species Faire** was created to recognize and celebrate Earth Day? The Faire was held in March and April for the first few years before it eventually became established on the first Saturday of May.

BEC hosted the first Endangered Species Faire on March 22, 1980. The theme was "Call of the Wild". The third Endangered Species Faire was a weekend-long event in April 1982 and was held at the Bidwell Nature Center on East 8th St.

During the past decades, the Faire has evolved from a local event into one of regional recognition. Everyone who attends has the opportunity to broaden their knowledge and appreciation for the natural world. With a full day of exhibits, activities, presentations and entertainment, approximately 5,000 individuals of all ages visit and participate in Northern California's oldest annual environmental faire held in Bidwell Park.
