Fracking Ban Hits a Snag: The Good, the Bad, & the Ugly *But there's more than a silver lining...*

Would you like the good news or the bad news first? Let's start off with the bad...

The Bad: We all felt a deep sense of disappointment (and anger) on July 29th when the Board of Supervisors voted for a 30-day study, thereby **preventing the fracking initiative from going to the November 2014 ballot**. After hundreds of volunteers worked for months to collect 10,000 signatures, and after winning in Butte County Superior Court on July 23, there was a brief window of optimism that we had achieved success! Despite the victory in court and despite the validation of almost 8,000 signatures, the Board of Supervisors voted for further study, effectively delaying the initiative to the June 2016 ballot. [Read all about it in the in the Chico News & Review](#). *But we knew the campaign trail was going to get **ugly** (see below) and there is actually **some good news** to report...*



The Good: The good news from the July 29th Board of Supervisors meeting is that they finally **voted to move forward the county's own ordinance to ban fracking**. Back in April 2014, Supervisors voted 4-1 in support of a ban on fracking and directed County staff to draft such an ordinance. Since that time,

we've been asking that the county's own ordinance move forward for full public review. **Now the supervisors have finally granted the green light.** The path toward final adoption will likely take many months but if the county is wise, they will be eager to adopt their own ordinance well before the June 2016 election.

The Ugly: Over \$100,000 was spent in only two months by the Oil industry-backed political action committee known as "Californians for Energy Independence" to intervene with our grassroots efforts to ban fracking in Butte County. **While the entirely volunteer-led efforts of Frack-Free Butte County worked hard to gather over 10,000 signatures,** well-paid lawyers and political consultants got big bucks to derail our efforts through the courts and in our local government chambers. The fact that anti-fracking activists in communities everywhere have faced the same David vs Goliath odds makes this no less painful. Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens trying to protect water will be undermined by the powerful interests of those with money.

A Crack in the Climate: The Butcher Shop Show


